The joy of the season was carried forward from virtual to actual as happy students then visited School for some fun, dance and play in the School grounds.














Stay Smart online (III-V)

Stay Smart Online (VI-VIII)



Well Being Workshop - "Happy Earth, Happy We!"



Showing flags of different countries and children have to guess which country's flag and have to guess which language is spoken in that country.


World of languages (Grade VI-X)


Power point presentation on culture (Grade VII-X)

Pre Nursery

Literacy: Our little ones recapitulated the letter stories done before with full enthusiasm. They narrated the same in their own words. The children came up with the new vocabulary words starting from a particular letter and did free hand drawings of the same. They enjoyed playing scavenger hunt game.



UOW- The children enjoyed learning modes of transport. They did craftwork and various other activities related to the same. The children took part in the Rhyme recitation activity in which they showcased their favourite means of transport .





Numeracy: Our tiny tots did a recapitulation of numbers and did the craft as well. They made a swan using number 2. They integrated it with uow, means of transport by pasting 2 pictures each of air, land and water transport.

Nursery

Literacy and Phonics: The tiny tots of grade nursery were excited as they recalled the letters sounds and the formation through quiz, games and presentations.





Numeracy: Practice makes perfect' was seen when Nursery students got busy in a fun activity to revise the numbers 1 to 9 as they randomly picked up number cards and used kidney beans to quantify the number displayed along with this child learnt about Backward counting.

UOW: Children learnt about different seasons through quiz and riddle activity. They also learned the difference between season and weather. During Eco club Nursery children have raised the issue of Air pollution. They learnt how plants are helpful to control air pollution. Children brainstormed different modes of transport and played related quizzes to get more clarity of the concept.





Kindergarten

Literacy: The Kindergarteners had fun as they learnt about blends and picked up new words along the way. Their Padlet Wall was itself a beautiful blend of pictures that showed how young minds fly on the wings of

imagination!

Grade I






