





## learning progression at RVS



Learning progressions show the way forward



**Grade 4** – Alphabets, basic Vocabulary – Colours, days, months, Body parts, Professions, Hobbies. A student is able to introduce himself in German.

**Grade 5** – Sentence structure, framing questions, new verbs. They are able to understand keywords in dialogue discussions and Texts.

Grade 6 – E-mail writing / informal letter writing, role play, Dialogue discussion.

**Grade 7 –** Students are able to understand and read long texts. Derive important information from the text and summarise it in German.

**Grade 8** – Learn different tenses in German. Good German vocabulary and are able to write Paragraphs, emails, and Translation of Texts related to topic done in class.






## How do we teach 3<sup>rd</sup> language at RVS


