First day of the new session began with a visit to the organic farm where the students of Grade VII observed different vegetables growing as an introduction to the topic "Nutrition in plants".



A session on inclusion was conducted for the students of Grades 8-12. The students were asked to explain what their understanding of Inclusion is, this was followed by a brief interaction on 'How at RVS we are an Inclusive Community'.



The ability to make good observations is also essential to the development of scientific skills. Students of Grade VII observed the slide of stomata under a microscope while learning about photosynthesis.



Special:

A Session on Rebooting K 12 education in the context of new NEP was conducted by Shri Anurag Tripathi, IRPS CBSE Secretary at RidgeValley School. The session was attended by educators from three different DLF schools. Shri Tripathi began the session with the emphasis on the purpose of life and happiness as the ultimate purpose. He stressed upon the role of educators in developing the 21st century learning skills in young learners. He also talked about the various documents which every educator should read to understand the importance of Competency based education.
